### JUDGE ADVOCATES CORNER:

DAV's National Legislative Department takes the resolutions adopted by DAV members at our annual National Conventions to Congress to advocate for improved federal laws, regulations and policies of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and other federal agencies whose programs support the veteran population.

For over 100 years, DAV has been advocating for better federal veterans programs, benefits, health care and transition services for the men and women who served, their families and survivors. DAV's National Legislative Department takes the resolutions adopted by DAV members at our annual National Conventions to Congress to advocate for improved federal laws, regulations and policies of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and other federal agencies whose programs support the veteran population.

DAV's key legislative priorities are detailed in the Critical Policy Goals brief linked below on this page. Please review these goals, participate in the Commander's Action Network, and use the links below to ensure you are an effective advocate when meeting with your members of Congress and addressing these priorities and other important issues impacting veterans. Grassroots advocacy and your active participation is the key to our collective strength in Washington, D.C., and achieving more legislative victories for veterans in the year ahead.

117<sup>th</sup> Congress Year in Review some of the crucial laws passed in 2022.

**PACT ACT -** The Honoring Our PACT Act was enacted on August 10, 2022, and became Public-Law 117-168. **FILE YOUR INTENT NOW NO LATER THAN AUGUST 10, 2023.** 

**Cost of Living Allowance** - H.R. 7846, the Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2022, provided an 8.7% increase for all disability compensation rates effective December 1, 2022. DAV supported this bill in accordance with 2021–2022 DAV Resolution No. 070, to provide for realistic cost-of-living allowances. The Veterans' Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act was enacted on. October 10, 2022, and became Public Law 117-191.

MST Claims - H.R. 2724, requires the Department of Veterans Affairs to ensure that each individual who files a claim relating to military sexual trauma is assigned a peer support specialist during the claims process, unless the individual elects to not have such support. The MST Claims Coordination Act was enacted December 27, 2022, and became Public Law 117- 303.

**Women's Veterans** - Women Veterans † S. 2102, the Dr. Kate Hendricks Thomas SERVICE Act, expands eligibility for VHA mammography screenings to veterans who served in certain locations during specified periods, including those who were exposed to toxic substances. The Dr. Kate Hendricks Thomas SERVICE Act was enacted on June 7, 2022, and became Public Law 117-133.
